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1 OWNER'S FAVE

This Danish linen tablecloth (\$175) from the early '70s once belonged to Talbot Waterman, a famous marine biologist and Harvard alum.

2 EDITOR'S PICK

Chunky handmade silver necklaces with semiprecious gemstones (starting at \$275) were created by Pamela's daughter Nicole Rueda Watts, also the store's manager.

3 LOCAL FLAVOR

Tobias Shepard's Arrows (\$1,800) is made of grocerybag logos from Martha's Vineyard.

4 TALKING POINT

Italian-chromeand-glass lamps (\$1.200 for two) from the 1970s embody the essence of the pop era.

5 MOST VERSATILE

These 1960s Arzburg china cups from Bavaria (\$42 for four) are similar to those in the permanent collection of New York's Museum of Modern Art.

6 OWNER'S FAVE

A 1960s porcelain coffee pot by Bareuther & Company (\$42) is "like all German chinavery beautifully made," says Watts.

7 BEST INVESTMENT

"You can really see the Spanish and Latin influences in the scrollwork," says Watts of this 1950 solid mahogany bureau by Edmund Spence (\$3,500).
