Hudson's Jill Goldberg mixes modern, traditional, and glam in a South End living room. BY ANNE VICKMAN



1 Custom “brancheliers” by Deanna Wish, made from hickory boughs, are dramatic without being overpowering. “We needed something absolutely unique up there,” says Goldberg. **2** Ethan Allen wing chairs, accented with Thomas Paul pillows, are a great fit for the hip homeowners. **3** “I’ve been going nuts with vintage brass-elephant figurines,” admits Goldberg. “It’s a fun, unexpected element.” **4** The silver resin Oly cocktail table “adds an element of glam” and allows seating to be rearranged easily. **5** Louis ghost chairs in Lucite keep the room airy and open. **6** Somerset Bay Home’s neutral entrance console with French legs is the most traditional piece in the room. “The lines of this are beautiful, and it’s a departure from the other elements,” says Goldberg. **7** Williams-Sonoma block-print and Hudson ikat pillows add color to a tufted Horchow tuxedo sofa.

8 For storage, Goldberg found these Oly Elisabeth buffets with mirrored fronts. **9** “We wanted to use the tallest sconces we could find,” says Goldberg of the pair from Hudson that hangs above the fireplace mantel. “They add a touch of old Hollywood.” **10** A custom mirror from Fast Frame emphasizes the room’s high ceilings. **11** Silver mercury-glass candleholders and Asian foo dogs from Hudson meld traditional and modern. **12** Succulents make for low-maintenance greenery. **13** The Roche Bobois armchair “has a traditional line, but we chose a funkier fabric,” says Goldberg. **14** When the homeowners saw the colors of the custom wool Landry & Arcari rug with an inlaid silk leaf pattern, they “had to have it.” **15** A ceramic garden stool provides texture.
